

TELL THE STORY

Choose these activities to help you reinforce the story we have just learnt about.



Children's Bible

The story of Abraham and Sarah is in most Children's Bibles so why not check out if it's in yours?



The Brick Testament

Check out the lego retelling of the story of Sarah in the Brick Testament <u>here</u>.



Crossroad Kids Video

Yes, this is the same video I linked last week for Abraham, but it's so good I thought I'd link it again! Check it out from Crossrad Kids <u>here</u>.



Bible App

The Kids Bible App also retells the story of Abraham & Sarah, download it <u>here</u> and look for the story 'God's amazing promise'.



GET ACTIVE

Choose these activities if your child learns best through physical activities and games.



Egg Walking

Try out walking on eggs like we did in the video! You need to take off your shoes and socks and only put one foot on (not both like Jonas did and cracked them all!). Then challenge your parents!



Shields Of Faith

Using your shield of faith from the craft sections test out it's strength by getting others to throw rolled up paper balls at you!



God Using Our Faith

Blow up a balloon and release it watching the air blow out, can you get it to hit a target? Now follow the instructions at <u>Flame Creative</u> <u>Ministries</u> to show how God can guide us in our faith.



Where's Sarah's Baby?

Take a baby doll or a draw picture of one and hide it in the room then challenge everyone else to find the hidden baby. Remember how Sarah had faith that God would give her a baby.



HANDS ON

Choose these activities if your child enjoys getting creative and constructing things.



Make Sandwiches

When the three visitors from God came to Abraham and Sarah they gave them lunch. Make some sandwiches to eat together and chat about your favourite part of the story.



Baby Isaac Cakes

Make some baby cakes like the ones from <u>Mum</u> <u>in the madhouse</u>, you can even eat them with the sandwiches you just made!



Play Doh Hearts

When God's promise came true and Sarah had a baby she laughed with joy - make some play doh hearts to celebrate God keeping his promises.



Hama Bead Hearts

If play doh is not your thing then why not make some hama bead or aqua bead hearts instead?



GET CRAFTY

Choose these activities if your child loves to cut, stick, sprinkle glitter and create!



Shield Of Faith

Make a shield of faith from <u>Ministry Ark</u> either print the template, colour and stick to cardboard or go freestyle and design your own. Paper plates make great shields too.



Sarah & Family Tent

Make your own paper scene of today's story with this paper tent and characters from <u>Sunday School Kids</u> (scroll down for the printable). Then retell the story with the characters!



Wool Wrapped Stars

God promised many descendants to Abraham and Sarah, as many as there are stars in the sky. Make these wool wrapped stars from <u>Red</u> <u>Ted Art</u> to remind you that God keeps his promises.



Paper Weaving Stars More stars to help us remember that God

More stars to help us remember that God keeps his promises, this time from <u>My Poppet</u> and made from weaving paper.



GO DEEPER

Choose these activities to help your child dig deeper into the Bible and take time to pray.



Learn The Memory Verse

This week's memory is the same as last week's Proverbs 3:5, so hopefully you're starting to remember it - this week try saying it before bed each night.



Study The Bible Together

Read Sarah's story together in Genesis 18:1-16 and Genesis 21:1-7. Think about the different times Sarah laughs - what do you think she was thinking and feeling at those different times? What do you think Sarah would tell you about God & his promises?



Prayer Activity

Why not create a prayer jar. Write prayers on paper or lollipop sticks and pop them in an empty jar. Each day take out one prayer and say it together as a family.
