Summary

In Luke 10, Chrissy helped us to see that there's a shift in Luke's story from telling us who Jesus is to showing us how Jesus trained his disciples so they would be prepared to serve him even when he was no longer with them physically. In this chapter, we looked at 2 essential skills that Jesus was teaching the disciples - loving God and loving others.

Questions that might help start discussions

- 1. What most surprised you or stood out to you from this chapter or in what Chrissy taught?
- 2. Chrissy told the story about training to work for the US Postal Service. She pointed out that the intensity of the training helped her to recognize the seriousness of the job she was taking on. What does the training and teaching that Jesus does with his disciples teach you about the job he has for those that follow him?
- 3. Jesus describes what it should look like for us to love others in what he says in Luke 10:7 and 33-35. What do those passages teach us about the way Jesus expects us to love others? What stands out to you about that? What do you find challenging? Is there anything about it that encourages you?
- 1. In v. 38-41, we have a picture of what it looks like to love God by being with him and building a relationship by giving God our time and attention. Chrissy quoted Martin Luther who said, "I find that I'm so busy that I now need to read the Bible and pray 3 hours a day." What did you think of those ideas? What has your experience been of building a relationship with Jesus? Can you relate to what Martin Luther said?
- 2. The main idea was to consider these 2 key areas in our lives loving God and loving others and recognizing we need to do both well to follow Jesus as he asks. What are your natural tendencies in these areas? Do you find one easier than the other? What can you do to bring balance to those areas of your life?
