## **Luke 22 Livechat questions**

## **Summary**

In Luke 22:7-13, Luke describes the preparations being made for Jesus to eat the Passover meal with his disciples. Luke captured a picture of the careful plan that was already at work as the disciples did what Jesus asked them to do. Chrissy pointed out that the further you zoom out on the story the more you can see Luke linking together the "plans" already in place that God was working through. In the midst of what could have appeared to be chaos, God was clearly at work.

## Questions that might help start discussions

- 1. What most surprised you or stood out to you from this chapter or in what Chrissy taught?
- 2. You could walk through each "plan" captured by Luke and discuss what is the plan at work and how is God using that in his redemption story.
- v. 1-6: Plans for evil
- v. 7-13: Passover plan
- v. 14-23: Jesus' reference to what is to come
- v. 31-34: Jesus' discussion of Peter's future
- v. 37: Jesus' quote from Isaiah 53:12 about the Messiah
- v. 42: Jesus' prayer in the garden
  - 3. Would you agree with Chrissy that there is comfort in knowing there is a plan or greater purpose in the midst of suffering? Why do you think that is? How do you we experience God's plan at work in those times?
  - 1. Chrissy reminded us that Luke wrote his account of Jesus' life so that his friend Theophilus could be certain of what he had been taught (Luke 1:3-4). What are the circumstances that most often create a need for reassurance in our faith? In what ways can we find the reassurance we need in those moments? What has helped you?
  - 2. Reflect on Genesis 50:20 and Joseph's story. How does that make you feel about God's plans?
