

Simple version



Amen.







Praying hands

Think of a friend who you'd like to tell about Jesus. Draw the shape of a person similar to your friend. As you colour it in, ask God to help you tell your friend







Angel Decoration


To make the Angel you will need:

A4 Paper – white or yellow foil, glue stick, glitter, scissors, white thread, pencil, colouring pencils,





1. Place A4 paper 'landscape' in front of you & fold in half. Open the paper back up & cut along the crease.



2. 'Accordion' fold the 2 pieces of paper. (like a fan)



Fold the paper over about 5cm from the top and press down firmly.



Repeat step 4 with the second piece of paper.



Glue in the fold and then press firmly together. Gently spread out the folded paper. Repeat with second piece of paper.



6. The angel body & wings are now complete.



Cut a piece of white thread, fold in half and knot.



8. Glue the long straight edge of one side of angel & attach thread.



Get the other side of the angel & press both pieces firmly together.



10. Gently spread out the folded angel. Rub glue over folds & sprinkle some glitter.



11. Draw 2 circles. On 1 circle draw & colour a face. Cut out the 2 circles.



12. Cover plain circle in glue & attach to thread.



13. Stick the face circle on top.
Press firmly together.



14. Cut some thin strips of foil.



15. Cover plain circle in glue & stick on the strips of foil to make the angels hair.



16. Add a couple of strips of foil to the front of the angel.

Make the angel

You will need:

- Paper and pencil for each player
- Dice

How to play:

- Each player has a turn to roll the dice.
- When the player throws the correct number, he draws that part of the angel.
- If the player throws the number he needs, then he can throw again.
- If the player throws the wrong number, then the next player takes his turn.
- The dice must be thrown to get the numbers in the right order to win the parts of the angel:
 - 1 = head
 - 2 = body
 - 3 = wings
 - 4 = arms
 - 5 = light cycle
 - 6 = feet
- The player who throws 6 first star.
- The player who finishes the picture of the first wins.




