Attendees will be required to wear a mask to sing. This will be highlighted in PA announcements, has been stated in all advertising and stewards will also ask those attending to wear masks to sing Additional disposable masks will be available for those who don't bring their own Staff and volunteers will sanitise their hands at the start and end of the event As attendees will not be entering a building or engaging with others attendance will not be taken, except of the staff and volunteers involved If the same microphone needs to be used by more than one person it will be sprayed or wiped with antibacterial spray or wipes before passed to the next user The fire pit will be permanently manned by a 		N
