Reducing risk of Covid infection: Ensuring children don't approach Santa	Volunteers, community members coming out their houses	Covid-19 is an infectious disease that can cause illness and for some result in death	<ul> <li>If a child approaches they remain the responsibility of their parents. However, volunteers including Santa will discourage children to approach asking them to remain on their property and at a safe distance.</li> <li>Should a child rush to Santa they will be greeted kindly, but taken immediately back to their parents by a volunteer</li> </ul>	N

Road safety, reducing risk of a volunteer being harmed by traffic	Volunteers, community members coming out their houses	Volunteers walking could be hit by a moving vehicle if they need to walk in the road to remain socially distanced	<ul> <li>One volunteer will hold responsibility for watching for traffic at all times</li> <li>Volunteers will wear light colours and reflective bands or jackets or carry torches/lights so that they are as visible as possible</li> <li>Should a vehicle approach all volunteers will immediately step aside and out of the road</li> <li>The time of the Santa walk will be chosen so that traffic is minimal</li> <li>On more main road Santa will walk on the pavement</li> <li>All volunteers will be instructed to be vigilant of vehicles at all times</li> </ul>	M	N
