A man sitting at the table with Jesus exclaimed, "What a blessing it will be to attend a banquet in the Kingdom of God!" Jesus replied with this story: "A man prepared a great feast and sent out many invitations. When the banquet was ready, he sent his servant to tell the guests, 'Come, the banquet is ready.'



But they all began making excuses. One said, 'I have just bought a field and must inspect it. Please excuse me.' Another said, 'I have just bought five pairs of oxen, and I want to try them



out. Please excuse me.' Another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'

His master was furious and said, 'Go quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and invite the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame.' Simple version

- 4. Who do you think is invited to God's party?






Parable: COME to my feast



Make time in your life for the things of God and don't forget to take care of the poor and helpless in this world and you will be blessed.




One day Jesus was invited to have a meal at the home of a well known Pharisee. Everyone was watching him. He told this story to the Pharisee.

- Who will reach the party first?



Father God, thank you for this story Jesus told of the great feast.


Thank You that you invite us to your party in heaven through Jesus.







The three excuses

Follow the lines to show which pictures of the story go together.



Craft



Rag Heart Welcome Wreath

To make the heart you will need:

Wire coat hanger, scissors, ruler, lots of scrap material.






 Bend & shape coat hanger into a heart.



Bend hook into a tear drop shape.



3. Cut a piece of material about 30cm long & 6cm wide.



 Fold material in half and then wrap tightly around hook.



When hook is completely covered, pull material ends tightly together & tie.



6. Cut material into strips measuring about 20cm long & then 1.5cm or 2cm wide.



7. To cover the heart you will need about 100 strips!



Tie the scraps of material on to the wire heart.



Make sure the strips are tied tightly & pushed together so there are no gaps.



10. The Rag Heart Wreath is complete!



White card, felt pens, pencil, scissors, glue stick, thread.



Fold card in half & draw a heart about 8cm high. Cut out.



Write 'Welcome' on one heartCroeso' on the second heart.



Cut a length of thread.
 Cover one heart with glue & place thread in the centre.
 Stick hearts together



14. Tie thread to handle of wreath. Make sure the heart dangles in the middle of wreath.

Party at home


How about holding a party for everyone in your household? You could prepare simple party food and games like charades, Simon says or pass the parcel. Enjoy!
